If outdoors, stay there. ___ Take cover. If indoors, do a “drop and cover” under a desk, table, or bench, or stand alongside an inside wall, in an archway, doorway that does not have a door, or corner. Avoid windows, doorways with a door, bookcases, hanging fixtures, or outside walls until the shaking stops.

Examples: • Follow your school district’s authorized procedures if student is a physical danger to self or others (behavioral emergencies) • Assess safety issues immediately. • Continue to use de-escalation strategies. Deflect and move away as needed. • Alert school staff and/or administrators of the situation.

Effective Classroom Policies and Procedures

Students should enter and exit the classroom quietly at all times. Whether coming in late, leaving early, or just going to the bathroom in the hallway, students must not disturb their classmates or other rooms. Reinforce this behavior at periods of transition such as lunch, recess, and assemblies.
