Background: This document provides evidence-based clinical practice guidelines on the management of adult patients with community-acquired pneumonia. Methods: A multidisciplinary panel conducted pragmatic systematic reviews of the relevant research and applied Grading of Recommendations, Assessment, Development, and Evaluation methodology for clinical recommendations.

Community-acquired pneumonia (CAP) remains a serious illness with a significant impact not only on individual patients but on society as a whole. Guidelines for the initial antibiotic management of CAP were developed in Canada in 1993 (1), and subsequently by the American Thoracic Society (ATS) that same year (2) and the Infectious

### Summary of Canadian Guidelines for the Initial Management ...

Definition Pneumonia is a breathing (respiratory) condition in which there is an infection of the lung. This article covers community-acquired pneumonia (CAP). This type of pneumonia is found in people who have not recently been in the hospital or another health care facility such as a nursing home or rehab facility.

The mortality rate in severe community-acquired pneumonia can be more than 50%. Over the past decade, some international guidelines for the management of community-acquired pneumonia have been developed in an attempt to optimize patient care. These guidelines have developed prediction tools to direct clinicians in the management of community-acquired pneumonia, including when to admit a patient to the ICU and selecting appropriate investigations and antimicrobial therapy.

Hospital-acquired pneumonia (HAP) is defined as pneumonia occurring 48 hours or greater after admission and excludes any infection that may be incubating at the time of admission. The

following guidelines are intended for the empiric management of HAP in immunocompetent adults without ventilator-associated pneumonia. Therapy should be tailored once culture and sensitivity results or other diagnostic information becomes available.

### **Diagnosis and Management of Community-Acquired Pneumonia ...**

Infectious agent The bacterium *Streptococcus pneumoniae* is the cause of invasive pneumococcal disease (IPD) and a common cause of community acquired pneumonia (CAP). For additional information about *S. pneumoniae*, refer to the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) website.

In Canada, invasive pneumococcal disease (IPD) is more common in the winter and spring. Pneumococcal disease has an incubation period that is not clearly defined, and may be as short as 1 to 3 days. *S. pneumoniae* can be spread by direct oral contact, respiratory droplets, or indirect contact with respiratory secretions of infected or colonized persons (e.g. sneezing, coughing or talking).

The American Thoracic Society and the Infectious Diseases Society of America have updated their guidelines on diagnosing and treating community-acquired pneumonia (CAP) in adults. Here are some of the changes from their 2007 recommendations, published in the American Journal of Respiratory and Critical Care Medicine:

### **Guidelines on Community-Acquired Pneumonia Updated**

Community-acquired pneumonia (CAP) is defined as an acute infection of the pulmonary parenchyma in a patient who has acquired the infection in the community, as distinguished from hospital-acquired (nosocomial) pneumonia (HAP). CAP is a common and potentially serious illness [ 1-3 ].

### **UpToDate**

These MRSA bacteria can be acquired in the hospital (called nosocomial) or acquired in your community or called community acquired MRSA. If you get pneumonia from one of these bacteria the community acquired form can actually become more severe. Normally, Staph cause skin infections like boils, or crusty sores.

### **community acquired pneumonia guidelines canada - MedHelp**

Hospital-acquired pneumonia (HAP) is pneumonia manifesting > 48 hrs after hospital admission. Early HAP (within 5 d admission) is often due to the same organisms (bacteria and viruses) that cause community-acquired pneumonia. Late HAP may be caused by community or hospital pathogens, the latter more likely in ventilated ICU patients.
