What are conveyancing searches? Property searches (also known as conveyancing searches) are enquiries made by your solicitor to find out more information about a property you plan to purchase. As part of the home-buying process, your conveyancer will carry out a variety of 'searches' with the local authority and other parties.

Conveyancing: Common solicitors' enquiries when buying a ...

The searches are a set of standard enquiries raised by the purchaser's conveyancer with a particular authority, for example the local search is raised with the local council, the drainage & water search with the water authority etc. Conveyancing searches deal only with the legal aspects of the purchase. They are not surveys and will not give information on the physical condition of the property.

Overview Of Different Types Of Conveyancing Searches

Normally, the buyer's solicitor will carry out the relevant searches on behalf of the buyer, but in some cases (such as where a property is sold at auction or by formal or informal tender), the seller (or his solicitor) will do so and provide a 'package' of search results to the buyer.

Searches & Enquiries - Practical Conveyancing

The price of the searches will usually be included in the overall breakdown of conveyancing costs from your solicitor. Conveyancers will usually offer a "search package" which includes all required searches, with prices ranging from £250 to £450 and can vary from location to location and the number of searches required.

Replies to Conveyancing & Pre-Contract Enquires - Explained. With most property transactions you will come across what are known as replies to enquires or pre-contract and conveyancing enquiries. Conveyancing searches are undertaken at the start of the process and can take anything between 3 and 8 weeks to complete. Much will depend on the Local Authority search (which takes the longest regardless of where you are in the country).

Buyer's Conveyancer confirms they have acceptable results from their searches, are happy with the answers to pre-contract enquiries and are in receipt of a mortgage offer (if any).
