CorHealth Ontario provides provincial leadership and planning for Ontario's 11 Regional Stroke Networks (RSN) by measuring performance, partnering to achieve best practices and creating innovations for stroke prevention, care, recovery and community reintegration. There is Level A Evidence that Stroke Unit care reduces the likelihood of death and disability by as much as 30% for men and women of any age with mild, moderate, or severe stroke.
