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Baumrind, Maccoby, & Martin: Theories of Parenting Styles and Child Rearing Baumrind (1966) developed a theory on parenting styles that proposed that parents fall into one of three categories of parenting styles, authoritarian, indulgent, or authoritative.

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This essay analyzes three models of parenting, namely, Chua's authoritarian style, Rosin's permissive style, and Aucoin's helicopter parenting style.
