### Structuring Your Restorative Nursing Program-2

Documentation to support the restorative nursing program With any effective restorative nursing program comes the necessity of documentation excellence. A key concept to keep in mind when building a restorative nursing program and documenting the program for each resident is that the program must occur at least six days each week for at least 15 minutes each day.

### Utilizing Restorative Nursing Programs to Optimize ...

• Range of motion must be delivered by staff who are trained in the procedure • The use of continuous passive motion (CPM) devices in a restorative nursing program is coded when the following criteria are met: (1) ordered by a physician, (2) nursing staff have been trained in technique, and (3) monitoring of the device. ○ Nursing staff should document the application of the devices and the effects on the resident

### Understand the Basics - AANAC

According to the RAI manual in Chapter 1, "While CMS does not impose specific documentation procedures on nursing homes in completing the RAI,

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documentation that contributes to identification and communication of a resident's problems, needs, and strengths, that monitors their condition on an on- going basis, and that records treatment and response to treatment, is a matter of good clinical practice and an expectation of trained and licensed health care professionals.

The clinical record and other documentation must substantiate the MDS coding of the restorative minutes, services, and days. The clinical record must also show evidence that the restorative program is being evaluated periodically by the licensed nurse.
