## **Instructional Design Models and Theories: Gestalt Theory ...**

Wertheimer, Köhler, Koffka, and their students extended the Gestalt approach to problems in other areas of perception, problem solving, learning, and thinking. The Gestalt principles were later applied to motivation, social psychology, and personality (particularly by Kurt Lewin) and to aesthetics and economic behaviour.

## **Gestalt psychology | Definition, Founder, Principles ...**

Max Wertheimer (1880-1943), Kurt Koffka (1886-1941), and Wolfgang Köhler (1887-1967) founded Gestalt psychology in the early 20th century. The dominant view in psychology at the time was structuralism, exemplified by the work of Hermann von

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Helmholtz (1821–1894), Wilhelm Wundt (1832–1920), and Edward B. Titchener (1867–1927).

There are several principles under Gestalt Hypothesis: Principle of Continuity. The Principle of Continuity states that whenever our eyes begin to follow something, they will continue to travel in that direction until they encounter another object. The eyes create momentum as they are compelled to move through one object and continue to another.

Over the years, Gestalt psychologists have come up with lists to summarize basic principles of visual perception, which have become invaluable tools for designers.
